It is my will for my wife Mary Rasson to sell the rest of my corn and cattle pay my debts and keep the rest. It is my will that my brother Wallace Rasson and three sisters named Nora, Ada, and Amanda Rasson receive five dollars each from my estate. Also it is my will that James Corder children receive five dollars each from my estate (they are my nieces and nephews).

It is my will for my sister Alice Wilkerson at my death to have my house and plunder. It is further more my will that the court appoint my wife Mary Rasson my executrix without bond and she sell and collect and pay to each one as directed in above will. This March 1st 1905
