1st In consideration of the valued services rendered to me and my daughter now single, by George B. Koecker and his wife (my daughter) Louisa, and taking into consideration, that what amount, I will herein give them, will be a very valuable thing, for their troubles, in their ministering to my wants in old age and infirmities, I do hereby give and bequeath to them the said George B. Koecker and wife, one hundred dollars to be paid out of the fund, coming to me from said George B. Koecker, for land sold heretofore and died made.

2^d I hereby give and bequeath to my children viz: John M. Duke and Louisa Duke his wife, the children of his first wife Mary, \$100=.

3^d Mary Stevens and Susan Loo's wife \$100=, 4th William Ford my son \$100= 5th Ann Maria Ann Ford my single daughter \$100= and to my daughter Louisa B. Koecker, wife of Geo B. Koecker \$100=.

6th I hereby appoint my sister law Geo B. Koecker, executor of this my last will and testament.

Warden, my executor, to see that the above will, be carried out, and to attend to his mother, this 2nd day of December 1868
