

In The Name of God Amen!

I, **Samuel Barnard**, of this County, Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, and knowing the uncertainty of all earthly efforts and calculations, and that sooner or later, that I must go the way of all flesh, I do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby renouncing all others, declaring this my only, true will.

First. It is my will and desire, that my executors hereinafter named do pay off and discharge, all my just debts, but to use all furniture, to resist the payment of any and all debts exhibited against my estate, that is believed to be unjust.

It is my will, that my two sons, **Wesley O. Barnard** and **Alfanzo Barnard**, be my executors.

I will and bequeath to my wife **Ann Barnard**, my entire farm, during her life, or widowhood; after the death of my wife **Alfanzo Barnard**, is to have and farm by paying to the estate four hundred dollars, provided he takes care of his mother.

I will to my wife three hundred eighty five dollars in silver and gold, also one choice horse creature or mule, also my buggy and rigging, one choice cow and calf, and six head of sheep, I also will all the house hold and kitchen furniture to my wife.

I have given to my son **W. O. Barnard**, one thousand and ninety four dollars, **Dr. Smith W. Starns**, five hundred and eighty nine dollars and eighty cents, **Dr. Sophine Barnes**, one hundred and eighty five dollars, **Dr. Wesley O. Barnard**, one thousand and seventy five dollars, **Dr. Alfanzo Barnard**, one thousand and thirty five dollars, **Dr. Almira Barnes**, one thousand and sixty five dollars, **Dr. Sally W. Barnes**, two hundred and thirty six dollars. All of the above amounts, is charged to said wife in my day book. I request, my executors, to make a sale, and sell all of my stock not otherwise arranged, also one half of the growing crop of corn and hay. I also authorize my executors to sell my interest in the Shinn farm, public, private as they think best. I wish an equal division among all the heirs, those that have not, around an equal share, with the above charges, to be made equal. As to the amount coming to **Synthia S. Starns**, I request, my executors to retain in their hands, and pay it to her as she may need.

I also wish **Sophine Barnes** hers, to have an equal share with the others. Given under my hand this 8th Sept 1870.

I, **Robert Wilson** of this County and State of Kentucky, do hereby make my last will and testament, in manner and form following:

1st I desire, that a sufficient amount of my perishable property, be sold to pay all my just debts and funeral expenses.

2nd After paying, my debts and funeral expenses, I give to my son **Henry Franklin**, a certain some colt, (which he now claims) and also his saddle which he claims.

3rd I give to my daughter **Susan Francis**, a choice cow, out of my stock of cattle.

4th I give the balance of all my property, both real and personal to my wife **Harvey Wilson**, to have and to hold, during her natural life or during her widowhood.

5th I desire, after the death or marriage, (should she ever marry) of my wife **Harvey Wilson**, that all my property both real and personal be equally divided among my lawful heirs, that is except my daughters, **Margaret Ann Ferguson** and **Minny Egell**, I desire that neither of them have any interest, in any of my lands or the proceeds thereof, but that they have their full share of the balance of the property, that may be distributable.

6th And lastly, I hereby constitute and appoint my wife **Harvey Wilson**, executrix of this, my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 8th day of October 1870
