

hopedwell field 8th To my friend Doct John Cungan I give my gold
 headed cane 9th To my friend Nancy Diggs who now lives in my family I give
 and bequeath three hundred dollars 10th To my executors hereafter
 named and to the survivors or survivor of them I give and devise in
 trust for the purposes hereinafter mentioned all my lands and tenements
 lying within Virginia Kentucky or the north western territory
 (except the lands herein before devised to my son William) mentioned
 in the devise to my executors to include all my undivided estate and
 interest in the lands and tenements belonging to the rope walk
 concern and I devise that my executors or survivor of them with at
 public or private sale (as to them shall seem best) sell all the said lands
 and tenements and convey the same to the purchasers 11th All my goods
 and chattels (except those herein before bequeathed and except my slaves
 I devise may be sold by my executors at public auction but they (my
 executors) may sell the shop of Thomas and me half of the schooner. Either
 at private sale if they think at best to do so 12th By the terms of the
 articles of copartnership between John Cungan William Alchier
 and myself in the Rope walk concern the property real and personal
 belonging to the said concern upon a dissolution of the partnership is
 to be sold or divided among the partners according to the respective share
 or interests of the said partners in the said concern I give three fifths
 the other two partners each own one fifth my wish is that the slaves
 belonging to the said concern may not be sold but that they be divided
 and I hope that the other two partners will consent to a division of
 the slaves These slaves namely my three fifths of the slaves belonging
 to the Rope walk concern as well as all my other slaves (except such
 as are herein before bequeathed to my children) I give and bequeath
 to my four daughters equally to be divided between them but my wish
 is that these slaves be hired out from year to year untill my daughter
 Mary Ann shall attain the age of eighteen years and the money
 arising from their hire shall be applied toward to the maintenance and
 education of my daughters and at the end of that year in which my
 daughter Mary Ann shall attain the age of eighteen years a division
 of these slaves among my daughters shall take place but if it shall happen
 that my daughter Rebecca shall be married before my daughter Mary Ann
 shall attain the age of eighteen years in that event my devise is that
 at the end of that year in which my daughter Rebecca shall be married
 that she (Rebecca) shall have allotted and set apart to her her share of these
 slaves that is one fourth part of them and the remaining three fourths
 of the said slaves shall continue undivided untill the end of that year
 in which my daughter Mary Ann shall attain the age of eighteen
 years and shall then (the three fourths) be equally divided among my
 three youngest daughters 13th Out of the proceeds of sale of my lands
 and tenements as mentioned in the tenth section of this testament
 and of the proceeds of sale of my goods and chattels as mentioned in the
 eleventh section of this testament my son William shall be
 entitled to receive three thousand dollars and the residue of

the said proceeds of sale (after paying the legacy bequeathed to Nancy Diggs)
 shall be equally divided among four daughters 14th The several portions
 given to my children when reduced into money will either be vested in the
 purchase of stock in the funded debt of the united States or be lent out on
 interest as to the guardians of my children shall seem best and the
 interest arising from their respective shares or portions (or so much of it
 as will be needful) will be applied to their maintenance and education
 respectively but if from any cause it shall happen that the interest
 together with the hire of the slaves shall not be sufficient for the
 education and maintenance of my daughters in that event so much
 of the principal as will be needful must be applied to that use 15th The
 legal estate in the lands and tenements belonging to the Rope walk concern
 is wholly in me altho the before named John Cungan and William
 Alchier are each entitled to one fifth part thereof when a sale of the said
 lands and tenements takes place my executors will convey the title
 to the purchasers 16th A slave named Ned commonly called Ned Dennis
 belongs to the Rope walk concern my wish is that this slave shall be
 emancipated and I hope that the other partners of the Rope walk concern will
 consent to it as far as I have any interest therein I desire him free and
 if on dividing the Rope walk slaves it shall happen that this slave shall fall
 to the lot of either of the other partners I desire that my executors purchase
 him and set him free but I flatter myself that the other partners will
 without hesitation consent to his emancipation without taking him to account
 in the division of the slaves 17th On 1st of June will be paid to me
 pro rata from the execution of debts due to me and I there should
 be an surplus of the debts due to me that surplus will be equally
 divided among my four daughters 18th I appoint my friend William
 Pennock of North Carolina to my son William until he attain
 the age of twenty one years and I appoint my brothers Thomas
 and Andrew Richardson and my friends Doct John Cungan and
 Charles Colman Guardians of my four daughters until my daugh-
 ters respectively attain the ages of twenty one years or shall be
 married these Guardians of my daughters will either act jointly
 as guardians of my four daughters or separately that is each acting
 as guardian of one of my daughters as often the Guardians may agree
 among themselves 19th And lastly I appoint my brothers John Alchier
 John and Andrew Richardson and my friends Doct John Cungan and
 Charles Colman to be executors of this Testament and as I have
 full confidence in their integrity I desire that no security be re-
 quired of them or either of them and in confirmation of this
 Will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 this 12th day of March in the year 1802.
