I, Josephine Palmer of the City of Richmond and State of Virginia being of sound mind and disposing memory, in view of the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, do make and ordain this as my last will and testament.

First: I desire and direct all my just debts and the cost of decent burial to be paid.

Second: I give and bequeath to Caroline Clayton the bed, bedstead and bed clothes in the room over the Kitchen in the house in which I now reside at No 424 north Sixth street.

Third: All the residue of my property, real and personal, now in possession or which may in future come to me from any source, I give and bequeath to my ad-

Fourth: I appoint Julius E. Rintz as Executor of this my last will and testament, and also as guardian of my adopted child Eureka Otis Palmer, and direct that no security shall be required of him in either capacity. As witness my hand and seal this 26th day of January 1893.
