

I, J. C. Barnett of the County of Ohio and State of Kentucky a farmer being of sound mind and understanding do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner & form following to wit:

It is my will & desire that all my just debts shall be paid out of the first money coming to the hand of my Executors.

I give and bequeath to my wife Mildred A. Barnett the following property additional to the property that is already and set apart to her by the laws of Ky. I desire my wife Mildred A. Barnett to have all the household & kitchen furniture, buggy & harness. I except a bureau & glass table out of household furniture along with a set chairs. I also give unto my wife two sets of gears & two plows and one harrow of her own selection out of my farming tools. The balance of my personal property to go to my legal heirs, excepting my wearing apparel & library which I give to my three sons or heirs G. W., W. B. and O. M. Barnett. I also give to my son C. M. Barnett my family Bible. I hereby appoint C. M. Barnett and Wood Insley my Executors and if either fails to serve from any cause I appoint H. B. Barnett to fill the place of the one that fails to serve as Executors. I hereby direct to my Executors to sell the remainder of my personal property not already mentioned above. I give out of my real estate, seven & one half acres of my tract of land I purchased of J. N. Snyder for off the East end adjoining the lands of J. F. Wallace to the Trustees of Wesley Chapel of the No Creek Circuit of the M. E. Church of the Ky Conference as a park for the use and benefit of the people.

If the M. E. Church & the M. E. Church South should ever unite in organic union it is to go with the united Church. The remainder of said tract of said J. N. Snyder tract I hereby direct my Executors to negotiate and exchange said lands for the parsonage of the M. E. Church adjoining my home place and I empower said Executors with power to make deeds & transfer my real estate as though I was doing it myself. Also to make any deed that may be necessary for the purpose of winding up my estate. I also direct my Executors in the event of their getting the parsonage property of the M. E. Church that my wife Mildred A. Barnett may have choice to have her own either the house I now occupy or said parsonage property with privilege of timber for said lands for repairing same along with necessary fuel with access to the range. I hereby direct my Executors to dispose of my personal and real estate and wind up my estate to the best advantage and if any disagreement between heirs to arbitrate same. My Executors are to have one dollar per day for their services along with all necessary expenses of attending and winding up my estate.
