I Charles Shulte being of sound mind & the fear of God before my eyes make this my last will and testament concerning my worldly goods. 1st I have bargained to my son Melvin S Shulte fifty acres of my land for which he holds my conditional bond he has to pay ten dollars per year during my natural life and there is ten dollars unpaid which ten dollars I decree that he pay to my beloved wife then 3rd fifty acres of land to be 1st Son forever. 2nd my son Thomas B Shulte also hold a similar bond for fifty acres and is yet four dollars behind, which I also decree to be paid my wife then 3rd land is to be his forever. 3rd my son Joseph S Shulte did also hold a bond for fifty acres which contract he has forfeited & therefore declare 1st contract void, failed null and void and that my beloved wife sell the 5th fifty acres of land for her benefit. 4th I decree that my beloved wife Ann Shulte keep as a home during her life the remaining fifty acres which is all the lands that I own. 5th I order that there be paid to my sons Samuel S Shulte & Frank S Shulte & Sarah A Person the sum of one dollar each. 6th I decree that after the death of my wife the fifty acres of land be given to Lilla B Lanham and Nancy S Shulte or her heirs provided they remain with their mother until her death and take care of her if only one of them remains & if so to have the 1/2 of 3rd land and should neither remain with her or fail to take care of their mother the same shall be equally divided between 2nd daughter together with Sarah A Person and Joseph S Shulte and that also all my personal property after the death of my wife be divided equally between my above named daughters and son Joseph S Shulte. 7th and lastly I decree my friend Wm H. Porter the ex. executor of this my last will and testament done in the presence of us all on the 2nd day of May in the year 1863
