I give and devise to my beloved wife Maggie Doherty all my personal and real property in the town of Rockport County of Ohio State of Kentucky consisting of the homestead on Short Street, one house & lot on Short Street and the Railroad, one house & lot on Long Street and the Railroad, one vacant lot on Main Street, one store house & lot on Main Street and Shop alley, one store house on Main Street and Railroad near Green River Hotel one house and lot on Water Street and two house and lot on Cemetery & Main Street. Also my farm in said County and State near Rockport consisting of 123 acres more or less.

Also my town property in Wichita Seppah County State of Kansas consisting of

eight town lots she however being directed to sell so much of the perishable property as may be sufficient to pay my just debts and she is also further directed and it is my will that she shall support and take care of my brother Edward Doherty. But in case they should separate I hereby give and devise the house and lot on Water Street and Five Hundred dollars out of my estate to my brother Edward Doherty and my beloved wife Maggie is also further directed that in case that there is not room in our family lot for me to be buried by the side of my son Owen, that he the said Owen be taken up and reburied with me wherever she may see proper to choose my resting place and provide suitable head stones for us, and she is further directed to give to a Priest One hundred Dollars (\$100) for masses for me and Fifty Dollars (\$50) for masses for our son Owen.

All the rest of my estate both real and personal of whatever nature or kind it may be I desire shall be given to my beloved wife Maggie Doherty.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Maggie Doherty my executrix without security of my last will and testament.
