 P. Stevens my home farm supposed to contain three hundred acres
 more or less and also to enable him to take care of his mother
 two hundred acres of land lying around the Bames hill, also
 my interest in a morning machine, 2^d I give to my daughter
 Emily Richards the land deeded to her by myself supposed to be
 forty acres more or less. Then all the rest and residue of my
 land I wish to be equally divided between the balance of my
 heirs, I will to my wife Susan one hundred and fifty
 dollars of the note which D. D. Dyer gave me, also the
 Walter Miller note for about two hundred dollars, I possess
 two Concord calves and hope enough to do her family for
 one year, one half of the young cattle, 3 plows and shovels
 five beds and bedding, one half of the charr and what of the
 furniture that the law would give her. I wish my daughter
 Fidelity to be made equal with the rest of my children, that
 she will have my horse Bell one cow and calf, one bed and
 bedding, also that she shall have all of her moneys collected
 school money. Then all the balance of my property together
 with the old Mill property to be equally divided between my
 heirs. I have and here make except James who has been
 provided for after my debts and funeral expenses are
 paid. I appoint John W. Taylor and my son James my
 Executors, to carry out this will.
