I wish it to be distinctly understood that I give and bequeath my seven young children, viz: John M. Stephen D. Job. William L. Martha, David and Amanda Arnold the following named tracts of land for them to have to their exclusive use and benefit and behoof to be divided equally between them or their heirs or assigns, viz: All of said land lies on the waters of Lantry Creek the first tract containing 1189 acres to them more or less and purchased by me of Mrs. J. Deall of the County of Maude and the 2^d containing 425 acres and the same purchased by me of Norton Audall and Mary E. Audall and two tracts of 100 of one and 200 acres of the other purchased of Ben- well Leitcher One hundred and two acres bought of Holland Morris Jr. and six; two and a quarter of Holland Morris Jr. and also one of 39 acres bought of Embrey's heirs and one of 57 acres bought of Jane Stewes for them to have and to hold and their heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my seven children aforesaid the following notes which are now due and bearing interest, viz: One note on John G. Hall for the sum of \$588.91 one on Henry Thomson for \$326.86. One on H. B. & J. B. Taylor for \$455.53 One on W. L. Miller for \$238.00. One on Henry W. Wilson for \$266.00 and One on Chas. Wheeler for \$200.00.

Said notes are all due and bearing interest, for my seven children aforementioned have and use to their exclusive use. I will and bequeath to my wife a comfortable living out of the within estate given to my children, and further I wish all my debts to be paid.

I, James L. Bean residing at Sulphur Springs P. O. Kentucky and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind do hereby make this my last will and Testament.

First, It is my will that after my death all of my debts, dues and obligations to others be fully satisfied and paid and I desire that all property both personal and real in possession, reversion or remainder belonging to me at which I have any interest or may have at my death - (except so much personal property as is exempt from creditors under the Laws of Kentucky and United States to every household or head of a family) be employed and used.

Second, It is my will and I hereby will and bequeath to my wife Jane Ellen Bean forever for her sole and separate use after my death and to be disposed of in such manner as she may elect so much personal property consisting of household and kitchen furniture, cattle, horses, sheep, sheep, farming implements so as may be exempt from execution for debts also so much of the real estate known as the homestead and exempt from execution for debts under the Laws of Kentucky and is situated at Sulphur Springs County of Ohio and State of Kentucky and consist of a one fifth interest in the tract of land upon which I now reside and known as the Sulphur Springs and containing about 200 acres.

Third, After the payment and discharge of my debts and the setting apart of the valued personal property for the use of my wife as above mentioned if any property of mine remain undisposed of after my death it is my will that the undisposed of residue be divided into three equal shares and one share given to my - One share to my son William D. Bean, one share to my daughter Mary Ellen Cannon and one share to my daughter Ida Belle Bean in addition to the advances made to them in the past years by me.

Fourth, The property hereby devised and bequeathed by my wife Jane Ellen Bean and to consist of so much as is exempted from execution for debts under the laws of Kentucky and the United States is to be without any charge or incumbrance in behalf of any of my children Curtis D. Bean, William D. Bean, Mary Ellen Cannon or Ida Belle Cannon.
