Share & Share alike should any attempt be made to  
break or set aside this my last will than the first of the  
one thus attempting to break or set aside this is to  
go to the others and they the one or ones trying to break or  
set aside this my will are to receive nothing.

I, G.C. Shultz of the County of Ohio and State of Kentucky, being of sound  
mind and memory do make and declare this to be my last will and testament to wit:  
first that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall be first fully paid, Second I  
give devise and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my estate both real and  
personal to my heirs and assigns forever as follows, I have already give to my oldest  
child C.O. Davenport one tract of land and personal property to the amount of about  
Eight Hundred and fifty dollars, and I have already give to my next oldest child G.W.  
Shultz one tract of land and personal property to the amount of about Eight hundred and  
fifty dollars, and I have already give to my third child J.C. Shultz one tract of land  
and personal property to the amount of about Eight Hundred and fifty dollars and I  
hereby give to my fourth child J.R. Shultz One hundred and fifty dollars or something  
equivalent in value to said sum, and I have already give to my fifth child Edna B.  
Wilson one tract of land and personal property to the amount of Eight hundred and fifty  
dollars, and I hereby give to my wife and my son Ebbon G. Shultz my home farm of about  
100 acres of land also I further give to my wife Smanthus C. Shultz and Ebbon G. Shultz all  
of the stock and provisions and all of the farming implements that may at my death be  
left, and at the death of my wife Smanthus C. Shultz all property both real and personal  
shall go to Ebbon G. Shultz, and I further give to my wife Smanthus C. Shultz and Ebbon  
G. Shultz Three hundred and fifty dollars, and I hereby give to my daughter Edna B. Wilson  
the 2 land notes and interest on same that I hold against John L. Wilson--to have and to  
hold in her own name to use as she sees fit or as she needs, and I further give to my  
son G.W. Shultz my entire entire Bank Stock of the Green River Deposit Bank of Rochester,  
Ky, and I further give to my son J.C. Shultz Five hundred dollars in notes or cash, and  
I further state that if there is anything left after the above distribution has been made  
I give all of the remainder to my wife Smanthus C. Shultz and Ebbon G. Shultz, and I nominate  
and appoint my two sons G.W. Shultz and J.C. Shultz to be the Executors of this my last will  
and testament without bond, hereby revoking all former wills by me made in witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this November, 10-1903.
