I John Maddox of the County of Ohio and State of Kentucky being of Sound Mind and disposing Memory and realizing that I am constantly approaching that end appointed for all the living and being desirous of making such a disposition of all my earthly affairs as will be just and equal towards all my heirs do therefore make ordain and publish this my last will and testament in the name of God Amen

conveyances of the certain tracts or parcels of land where my sons R D Maddox and S L R Maddox and my daughter Sarah Brown and her husband Alfred Brown now reside unto them their heirs and assigns forever I therefore ordain and appoint that they shall each receive one dollar additional and that these gifts and conveyances shall constitute their part of my estate 5th It is my will and desire that the remainder of my personal property be appraised by such men as my Executors may have appointed for that purpose and that they proceed to divide the same in such a way and manner as shall in their judgment be equal between my daughters Mary B Rine, Elmer R Taylor, Elizabeth & Cassien Passanah & Fannie Charlotte DeHeuer and the children of my daughter Paulina D Baker deceased provided however that the said children shall only draw an amount equal to that that may fall to the share of each of my said daughters 6th It is my will and desire that the proceeds of my notes and accounts and such cash as I may have on hand after paying my just debts and the legal fees of administration shall be equally divided among my daughters Mary B Rine, Elmer R Taylor, Elizabeth & Cassien Passanah & Fannie Charlotte DeHeuer and the children of my daughter Paulina D Baker deceased provided however that said children shall only draw an amount equal to that that may fall to the share of each of my said daughters 6th It is also my will and desire that E G Rinder shall be a co-trustee who shall receive the share of my estate that may be due the said infant children of my said daughter who shall execute to my Executors a Bond for the payment of said money to those children upon their marriage or when they shall become of age, the said money to bear interest from date of said Bond until paid as above provided and the said E G Rinder to have for his trouble legal commission and all legal taxes

7th Furthermore I appoint my sons R D Maddox and D R Maddox Executors of this my last will and testament who shall not be required to give security, It is also my earnest wish and desire that the funeral services upon my death shall be preached by Bro A B Smith if possible and if there should be no Sermon preached before my body is laid to rest I desire that there shall be no funeral Sermon preached at all. By this my will and desire it is to be seen that there shall be no sale of any property whatever in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 17th day of June 1875
