

I, W. B. Hardisty, of near Westerfield in Ohio County Kentucky, being aware of the uncertainty of life and in failing health, but of sound mind and memory, do make and declare this to be my last will and testament, in the manner following, to wit:

1st I give, devise and bequeath unto H. S. Ward my entire property, personal and real estate to hold forever as his own, consisting of all household kitchen furniture and appurtenances thereto. Also my horses, cattle and hogs and all my farming utensils, and lumber.

2nd - I further will that said H. S. Ward pay off the mortgage now against my real estate in favor of Mrs. Better Ralph in full and all outstanding debts, and that my remains after death be laid in the Elm Wood Cemetery at Owensboro and that a Four Hundred Dollar monument be erected over my grave and that my picture shall be engrained on said monument.

3rd I further will and decree that said H. S. Ward shall have two years (2) from the time of my death in which to erect said monument.

4th - Hereby nominate and appoint said H. S. Ward my sole executor and direct that he shall sell or dispose of any of my personal property or real estate as may seem best to meet the ends before suggested.

5th I further will that said H. S. Ward shall be required to give bond to carry out the provisions of this testament as above stated.

6th It is in consideration of the valuable services I have received at the hands of said H. S. Ward and his wife Mollie Ward during my illness and the love and respect I have for them that I made this disposition of my effects.

I give my Grandson Robert Smith my Church Bible.
