

Be it remembered that E. W. F. Miller, of the County of Ohio, State of Kentucky, do make this my last will and testament as follows:

It is my will that my wife, Eda Miller be my sole heir in trust during her natural life; viz, I give, devise and bequeath unto her all my property both real and personal for her use and benefit only, during her natural life, appointing her as sole executrix without bond to carry on the business, buying, selling and trading in both personal and real property as though I were alive, viz, having sole and complete control of my business the proceeds nor principal to be used except for her own use thereof, with the following exception, viz:

My daughter Carrie is to live with my wife Eda, until said wife's death, or until my daughter Carrie marries, should she marry before said mentioned date, and out of the proceeds (or principal if necessary) of my estate shall my said daughter receive her support just as she has always done. I will further more that should my said daughter Carrie marry during the lifetime of my wife, she is to have out of my estate or the proceeds thereof one good horse and one good cow.

I further order and direct that at the death of my wife, Eda, I give, devise and bequeath unto my six children, J. Fannie Mal, Lucy E. Cender, Edward F. Miller Arthur H. Miller and Richard D. Miller, all my property both real and personal after all my debts are paid.

Each of the above mentioned children to share and share alike with the exception of Edward F. Miller who is to pay into the one hundred Dollars when he then shares out of the estate equally with the other children.

I further will that my daughter Carrie shall have the Piano now in use if she desires same at the value of One Hundred and Twenty Five and no/100 Dollars. It is my further will, and

I hereby appoint my son Edward F. Miller and my cousin E. P. Neal as my executors who shall execute a good and sufficient bond, and wind up my estate carrying out this my will.

In witness whereof I have signed and sealed and published and do declared this instrument as my will, at Beaver Dam Ky this April 20th 1895.
