I Christian Caple, of the County of Pendleton being sick and weak in body, of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I do and bequeath the same in manner following:
1st I give to my wife Catharine Caple, supposed to be twelve acres of land lying on the broad ridge road known as a part of the Amos Ashcraft tract of land bounded on the East by A Pasture lot on the North by the Shadelot on the West by the land of Isaac Dostin, and on the South by the Broad Ridge road.

2^d I give to my wife Catharine Caple all my hogs and cattle and horses

3^d I give to my wife Catharine Caple all house furniture also all the grain on the place where I now live

4th I wish the place where I now live to be sold and all my just debts paid of anything left to go to my wife.

5th I hold a note on Margaret Leonard for two hundred and fifty dollars due the first day of March 1871, if this note is needed towards paying my debts, for to be used for that purpose, if not to go to my wife.

6th I give to my son Philip Caple my only child one dollar in cash, and all that remains at my wife's death
