Also I give to my daughter Mary Simpkins Bodily Sixty five dollars.

Also I give unto my grand daughter Susannah daughter of Saml Works late Saml Bydell now the wife of Henry Work twenty five dollars also twenty five dollars to the balance at the hour of the aforesaid Saml Works
