But I remit to each of them one half the amount of the above named sums and without any further demand against ^{them} either from myself as well as well all others whatsoever they having given me their obligations and the obligations of others for the payment of said tracts of land being the half as above stated

5th I further direct that my wife shall in addition to the land given her during her life receive one hundred dollars from moneys due me or from the sales of my Personal Property for separate use and also three
