I William Isher being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do hereby make and publish my last will and testament as follows.

First It is my will and desire and I hereby direct that all my estate both real and personal, after the payment of my debts and funeral expenses which I may pass at the time of my death, be distributed as the law prescribes between my Widow and heirs.

Second In order that my will and desire in this particular may be carried out and rendered effectual, I hereby constitute and appoint Mr. John William Isher and James L. Bonar as my Executors.

Third that in the settlement of my estate my widow is to be charged with the sum of one thousand dollars, being two notes transferred to her Executed to me by William Isher to my son as part of the purchase money for a tract of land purchased of me by my said son, being my home farm and the one on which I now reside the said two notes of five hundred dollars each, being one third of the purchase money which the said William Isher so bound himself to pay for the said farm.

In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 16th day of January 1836

I Isaac Bellier of the County of Pendleton & State of Kentucky do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and form following, That to wit say

1st I desire that all the perishable part of my estate be immediately sold after my decease and out of the moneys accruing therefrom all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid

2nd After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses I give my wife Betsey Bellier the farm on which I live during her lifetime and after her decease I give the same to my Children hereinafter mentioned equally to be divided among them and to be enjoyed by them forever

3rd I have given to my eight Children in their marriage and leaving me one hundred dollars each in property, namely William Bellier, James Bellier, Nancy Ann Woodward late Nancy Ann Bellier, George Woodward late George Bellier, John & William Barrett, Wiley Bellier, Lewis Franklin Bellier, Martha Casey late Martha Bellier & do hereby direct that Martha's portion of my estate to be placed in the hands of my executor, for her separate use & Children. 4th I have sold to Barrett Wiley Bellier one hundred & nine Acres of land on the waters of Blanket Creek amounting to five hundred & forty five dollars, also I have sold to Lewis Franklin Bellier one hundred acres of land on the waters of Blanket Creek amounting to five hundred dollars. But I remit to each of them one half the amount of the above named sums and without any further demand against ^{either} them either from myself as well as well all others whatsoever they having given me their obligations and the obligations of others for the payment of said tracts of land being the half as above stated

5th I further direct that my wife shall in addition to the land given her during her life receive one hundred dollars from moneys due me or from the sales of my Personal Property for separate use and also three

Woods and bedding one cow & calf Cupboard with its entire furniture one cooking stove & fixtures one horse bridle & saddle such as she may select all of which for her separate use

Item 6 upon the final distribution of my estate of whatsoever kind it may be to be equally divided among my Children but in the event of the final distribution not being equal to the amount received out of the sale of the two tracts of land sold to David Wiley Nelson & Lewis Franklin Nelson in that case each of them are to pay to each of their Brothers & Sisters an amount making each of them equal in the proceeds of my estate and to be enjoyed by them forever

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint Mr. M. H. Woodward & John S. Nelson my executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other or former wills or Testaments by me heretofore made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day of in the year

Last will & Testament I John Hobday of the County of Pendleton State of Kentucky being in health and of sound mind and disposing memory and intending of John Hobday that in the Providence of God life is uncertain have thought proper to make and by these presents do make this my last will and Testament revoking and hereby annulling any and all former wills heretofore made by me and as touching the worldly goods which it has pleased God to bless me with I give bequeath and dispose of them as follows I give

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Hobday for and during her natural life the several and tract of land which I now own containing in the whole about two hundred acres and upon her death unto my son John C. Hobday and his heirs forever I also give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Hobday all my farming utenils such as my Cupboard and Cupboard ware and such household and kitchen furniture including beds and bedding as she shall choose to select I also give and bequeath to her the said Elizabeth Hobday five negro Slaves such as she may choose among all my Slaves choose to select my desire being that she have her choice from among all my Slaves so have and to hold them the uses and profits of them for and during her natural life and upon her death that the said five Slaves so selected by her and their issue belong and be the property of my two daughters Milly W. Bradford and Elizabeth C. Hobday one fourth and one fourth to my Grand daughter Myrtilla M. Coleman the daughter of my deceased daughter Mary Coleman and one fourth to my Grand Children Elizabeth Perkins Martha Boston W. C. Boston and John W. Boston the children of my deceased daughter Sally Boston I also give and bequeath unto my said wife my wagon and four horses her choice I also give unto my said wife such cattle hogs and sheep as I may own at the time of my death together with one year provision for herself and family Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my beloved deceased daughter Mary Coleman the Slave Cynthia and unto my deceased daughter Sally the Slave Amy and unto Milly Bradford the Slave Mary unto Elizabeth Hobday the Slave Charity and unto my Son John the Slave Charles I hereby confirm the gifts so made to them and I further hereby give and bequeath unto my daughter Polly Hume my negro Slave girl named Polly Item 3rd all the rest and residue of my Slaves
