

In the name of God Amen, I William Delaney of the County of Pendleton and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transient life do therefore make ordain public and declare this to be my last will and testament, that is to say, first after all my lawful debts are discharged, the residue of my Estate real and personal I give and bequeath to my wife Rebecca, during her natural life, and after her demise the said estate both real and personal to - divided as follows, fifty dollars to my Grand son Charles Edward Delaney, son of Richard J Delaney the balance of said Estate to be equally divided with my daughters Eliza Hurdons, Lucinda Chaney and Richard J Delaney.

Likewise I make constitute and appoint my friend Charles E. Sulist, to rent my farm and to pay the proceeds to my said wife and after her demise sell at public auction the said estate and pay as above directed, hereby revoking all former will by me made,

I James Campbell, of the County of Pendleton being of sound mind and disposing mind and memory, knowing the uncertainty of human life and being desirous of disposing of my estate, do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made.

After my death I direct my Executors hereinafter named to pay all my just debts and funeral expenses.

I direct my executors, after my death to rent out for such term or terms as they may think best all my real estate not hereinafter disposed of so long as my wife Isabella Campbell shall remain my widow, and out of the rents accruing from my said real estate my said executors are directed to keep my real estate in good repair, and the balance of the money arising from the rent of my real estate as before directed after payment of taxes and expenses of seeing to the same to be by my said executors put out at interest annually as the same shall become due for and during the widowhood of my said wife.

After the death or marriage of my said wife I direct my said Executors after they shall have given reasonable notice say at least fifteen

Reimbursement of Isabella Campbell all moneys of James Campbell, to their wife and children as per 2nd witness hands at 267

days previous thereto to sell all my real estate in grose or in parcels upon such land as they or such of them as may qualify may think best at public auction to the highest bidder or bidders, and the money arising therefrom to be by them disposed of as they hereinafter mentioned. I will and devise to my beloved wife Isabelle Campbell, for and during her widowhood the fifty acres of land I bought of Saul, H. Ashcraft the same on which I live, the use of the large pasture in front of my dwelling house, the pasture on the same side of the road on which my house is situated and extending up to and binding on the Knoxville road also the right to get from any part of my real estate a sufficiency of fire wood and timber to keep the said land, devised to her as aforesaid, and also the buildings thereon in good repair during the time aforesaid. I also devise to my beloved wife so long as she may shall remain my widow, two or three head of Cows as she may choose, also the three head of horses now owned by me if she shall elect to take them if not my executors are directed to sell them for the benefit of my Estate. I also will, to her for and during her widowhood all my household and kitchen furniture, all the farming implements on hand, a sufficiency of bread stuffs and animal food to take care of her for one year, also one new cooking stove if on hand at my death if not then I direct my executors to purchase one for her. I further direct my executors to see that my beloved wife shall have a sufficiency from the rents of my real estate to take care of her comfortably so long as she shall remain my widow.

5th I have heretofore advanced to my son John M. Campbell the sum of \$280, which said sum he must in any future distribution of my Estate be charged with.

6th I have heretofore taken care of and provided

for my daughter Elizabeth Mann, wife of Jack-son Mann when she was a widow for a considerable length of time for which I charge her as an advancement the sum of \$1000 cents and for which she must be charged in the future distribution of my Estate.

My Daughter Jane who ~~remains~~ married Henry Wallace did not during her life receive from me by way of advancement anything. I therefore have nothing to charge to her children on that account. Ellen Bennett, a daughter of my daughter Jane, is to receive from my estate the sum of five dollars, and no more. I make this difference between her and brother and sister because of her course in life. I will and devise to my grand children Elizabeth and Bennett, George H. Wallace, the other children of my daughter Jane Wallace the same interest in my estate which their mother if living would receive to wit, one fourth, to be by them received when my Estate shall be distributed as herein directed.

7th Having heretofore advanced to my son James W. Campbell in rents, property, money, notes, and property of mine which he sold and used the sum of \$2078.75 cents for which he must in any future distribution of my Estate account, until his brother John M. Campbell, and Mrs. Elizabeth Mann, and Elizabeth Bennett, and George H. Wallace, shall receive an amount equal thereto that is until John M. Campbell shall receive that amount, and Mrs. Mann shall receive that amount and Elizabeth Bennett and her brother George H. Wallace shall receive that amount, he is not to receive any more after that he is to share equally with them.

8th Being desirous of repairing the dwelling house in which I now live, and building a addition thereto of frame 30 feet long and 16 feet wide one story high and having the front house weatherboarded and made comfortable for my beloved wifes use during her widowhood, and during the uncertainty

of my life I direct my executors that should such improvements not be made, at my death to cause the same to be ~~done~~ made, at as early a day as practicable and to pay for the same out of any money an hands at my death or that may be owing me at my death or from the rents of my real Estate,

9^d I direct my executors to purchase for me and my family a suitable burial lot in the ~~leamstown~~ cemetery grounds, near Williams town Ky. and cause me to be buried therein I also direct them to erect at my grave and at the grave of my son Thomas S. Campbell, suitable tomb stones to be by them selected,

10 at the death or marriage of my beloved, wife, will and direct my Executors to sell all my real and personal estate and collect all monies then due my estate, and that the same be so divided so as to make my said children and grand children equal all herein before directed charging the advance by me herein mentioned

11th I desire that my executors shall receive a fair compensation for their services

12th Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my friends Thomas Bennett, and J. H. Menifee, Executors of this my last will and testament and invest them with full power and authority to sell and convey my real Estate as hereinbefore directed I hereby giving them full power and ample power to see that my real estate is not injured by improper husbandry, and all monies ~~due~~ due and to become due to me after ~~my~~ making the improvements as herein directed. I direct my executors to keep at interest during my wife's widowhood, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of January 1870.
