Ammerman, the farm where I now reside to be equally divided between them & furthermore I want my Grand daughter Nancy E. Ammerman to have her share whenever she may desire, and to have the farm five years from my death to raise her children on.

Fifth I want my son Andrew J. Shively to be my Administrator and the Guardian of my Grandchildren's children namely Nancy E. Ammerman's children.
