In the name of Amen, I William Cleveland of the County of Pendleton and State of Kentucky, being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory not knowing how soon I may be called to an immortal state do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore by me made, 1st I give and bequeath to my son Henry W. Cleveland my loved Horse called "Hiker." 2^d I give and bequeath to my son William Cleveland and to my Daughter, Margaret Mitchell one dollar each and the children of my late daughter, Harriet Brown, one dollar between them. All the balance of my property, of every nature or sort I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Peggy Cleveland for and during her natural life, and at her death I direct that is the said property left to my wife, shall be equally divided into three shares and that Fenton & Cleveland, Sally W. Cleveland, Louisa W. Cleveland shall each have one share. And lastly I appoint and ordain my son Fenton W. Cleveland, my Executor, to see this Will executed, In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 1st day of June 1842.

In the name of God Amen, I William Morris of the County of Pendleton and State of Kentucky, being severely afflicted in body with a dangerous disease, and knowing that it is appointed to all men to die, but being of sound mind and disposing memory, do therefore make and publish this my last Will and Testament.

1st I commend my soul to the God who gave it, and request that my body be buried in a decent manner, 2nd I direct my Executor, hereinafter mentioned to sell at public Auction on a credit discretionary with himself all my personal property of every description (except the articles hereafter specially devised) and pay all of my just debts out of the proceeds thereof. 3rd I bequeath to my beloved Wife Sidney Morris my old bay Mare, two Beds and Bedding, Cooking Utensils, one pair of Hens Year, one plough, one axe, and a sufficient quantity of Corn, Wheat and Pork for the sustenance of the family for one Year from and after my death.

I also bequeath to my beloved Wife Sidney all my Estate both personal and real, (after paying my debts, and the above special devised) during her natural life, or while she remains my Widow, but I request her to have my three children Elizabeth, John and Margaret well educated, as the means of my Estate will admit of, and I also request her to give to my three children named above as they shall severally marry or arrive at the age of Twenty One Years, such property as she can conveniently spare, but in no case shall she give more to one than to the others. At the transpiration of the former contingency, I direct that all of the remaining property of my Estate be equally divided between my said three children as near as may be, but at the transpiration of the latter contingency, I hereby direct that my Wife receive her legal dower, and the remaining two thirds be distributed equally among my children. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved Brother, Reuben Morris of Scott County Ky, my Executor, Given under my hand & seal this
