2^d) After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses I desire to have my estate both real and personal to be equally divided between my several sons and daughters hereinafter mentioned equally to be divided among them and to be enjoyed by them forever, James Wooldridge, Fanny Vance, John Wooldridge, Elizabeth Smith, William Wooldridge, Richard Wooldridge, Polly Miller, Sally Long, Patsy Picking and Jesse Wooldridge.

3^d) I give to my daughter Jane Wilson her executor and administrators five dollars

4th) All the rest of my estate both real and personal of what nature or kind soever it may be not herein before particularly disposed of, I desire may be equally divided among my several children herein before named which I give to them their heirs executors administrators and assigns forever.

And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my son in law William Vance and my son James Wooldridge executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other former wills or testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight, signed sealed published and declared as and for the last will and testament of the above named Richard Wooldridge in presence of us
