In the name of god Amen I William Smith
 being weak in body but sound in mind and memory -
 do hereby declare that it is appointed for all men once to die
 do hereby declare this to be my last will and Testament
 First it is my will and desire that the property that
 I lent my daughter Elizabeth that she shall enjoy it
 during her natural life and at her decease for it to be
 equally divided between her children. It is also my
 will and desire that the property I lent my daughter
 Alexander that shall enjoy it during her natural life and
 at her decease to be divided equally between her children
 It is also my will and desire to lend to my daughter
 Sally during her natural life the following Negroes to wit
 Vime & her child & Gaber & Gin and at her decease to
 be equally divided amongst her children if she has
 any at her death It also my will and desire that
 my daughter Virginia Baper when she comes of lawful
 age as Maria that she shall have during her life a lot
 of Negroes equal to the lot of my daughter Betsey
 agreeable to their value and at her decease to be equally
 divided between her children if she has any
 It is further my will and desire that after my last
 debts are paid that my beloved wife shall have
 during her natural life two hundred and fifty acres
 of land to include the house where I now live and
 for her to have it laid off as she may think proper
 and at her decease
 I do hereby bequeath the said two hundred and

fifty acres of land to my son William
 I also bequeath to my son James & Betty two hundred & fifty
 acres of land to be laid off at any side or corner of any
 lands that I may except the above mentioned land that he
 may think proper
 I also bequeath to my son George two hundred & fifty acres
 of land to be laid off at any side or corner that he may
 think proper out of any lands that I may have except the
 above mentioned lands

It is also my will and desire that my beloved wife shall
 have one third part of all my Negroes and personal
 property except what I have lent to my four eldest daughters
 during her natural life

It is further my will and desire that the rest of my
 property both real and personal be equally divided
 between my three sons and three youngest daughters -

It is further my will and desire at the decease of my
 beloved wife that the Negroes that I have left her shall
 be equally divided between my three sons and three youngest
 daughters If any of my children should die without a
 child It is my will and desire the Negroes and their
 increase that I alloted to them shall be equally
 divided between my surviving children

It is further my will and desire that my beloved wife
 John McCallister do execute this my last will and
 testament in Testimony Whereof I William Smith of
 Adams County and State of Kentucky have hereunto set
 my hand and seal this 13th day of February 1826

 keep possession of the property that I have left to my

At a County Court begun and held for the County of
 Russell at the courthouse in the town of Jamestown on
 Monday the 19th day of February 1827. The last will and
 testament of William Smith deceased was exhibited into
 court by Mary Smith one of the executors therein named,
 and proven by the oaths of William Green and Nancy
 Green subscribing witnesses thereto, and Alexander Waggoner,
 one of the heirs and devisees of said deceased, appeared
