In the name of God Amen I Elizabeth Black of Shelby
County and State Kentucky being sick and weak of body
but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for his mercies
and calling to mind that it is appointed for all to die do
make and Ordain this my last will and Testament in the
first place I commend my soul to God who gave it me
and my Body to the earth to be buried in a decent
manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned
and such worldly estate as it hath pleased the almighty
to bless me with I give and bequeath as follows I want
first it is my will that my just debts be faithfully and
promptly discharged and funeral expenses paid (I am)
I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Hannah Black
the whole of my wearing apparel (I am) my will
and desire is that my son John shall keep possession
of the plantation whereon I now live for the ensuing year
and then the whole of my estate equally divided amongst
my surviving children and the heirs of my daughter Mary
& Ruben deceased and whereas my son John Black
Parker has lived with me for a number of years
and was to have by contract one half of the produce
of the farm and was allowed for his trouble and
service it is my will and desire that if he and the
other heirs cannot agree upon the amount of said

Witness that it shall be sealed by me according to custom
 when aware shall bind both parties (them) I do hereby
 appoint and ordain my son John Parker and Baylet Laquer
 my executor of this my last will and testament hereby
 do annulling all former wills and testaments in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth
 day March one thousand eight hundred and fourteen
