 and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent
 manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned
 and such worldly estate as it hath pleased the almighty
 to bless me with I give and Bequeath as follows I want
 just it is my will that my last debts be faithfully and
 honestly discharged and funeral expenses paid (Item)
 I give and Bequeath to my beloved daughter Hannah Platt
 this whole of my wearing apparel (Item) my will
 and desire is that my son John shall keep possession
 of the plantation where I now live for the ensuing year
 and then the whole of my estate equally divided amongst
 my surviving children and the heirs of my daughter Mary
 Whitaker deceased and whereas my son John Platt
 Parker has lived with me for a number of years
 and was to have by contract one half of the produce
 of the farm and was allowed for his trouble and
 services it is my will and desire that if he and the
 other heirs cannot agree upon the amt of said
