 he would make them for him if he knew how he would
 he said he would make him in his own way, agreed with his wife
 & children the balance of his property he wanted his wife
 half of the was left after all his debt were paid
 he repeated at two different times when called on that day
 in the course of one hour he asked at one time if he wanted
 to go to his wife that he did not agree to but that she
 and should have their part of the land and she should have
 the rest to pay his debt and live on and raise the children
