I beg leave to report to the County Court of Shelby County as follows to wit Mrs Sely Figg and Mary his wife late the wife of Jacob Keykendall Carried into this County they brought with them all the personal Estate of the said Jacob Keykendall De^d Except 50 dollars which they settled with me and also all the money that they sold 300 acres of land for which was \$600 about one third of the value of said land which they were authorized to sell by the Will of said Decedent

They also promised to settle a Childs part of that with me but have always failed to do so in the year 1811 I prayed the County Court of Harden County to try to Secure the Estate as there was no security to the Executors at that time, and the Estate in my hands but the Court failed to take any of the Estate but the Slaves which were 5 in number which the Court took and put to hire according to law for the term of two years at the end of which Mrs Figg went and took them all but one and fetched them into this County where they have kept them until I was appointed by this Court to take Charge of said Estate and the money that they were here for money for the land they have scattered it - and there is no land for the heirs of J Keykendall De^d. - Now I wish this Court to say whether this Woman shall be entitled to one third of these Slaves without first giving up the whole of the real Estate

And in proceeding to assist to Mary Figg her dower in the Estate of the said Jacob Heykendall we first ascertained the whole amount of said Estate including the land held by her as Executrix in Hardin County and the personal property at this time in the hands of Charles F Wells Curator which is \$952⁰⁰ 72 1/2. In one third part of which the said Mary Figg is entitled viz \$329⁰⁰ 24. The said Mary Figg has received for the land sold in Hardin County \$600 for personal property in Hardin \$413⁰⁰ 33 making in all \$1013⁰⁰ 33 from which deduct her third part as widow \$329⁰⁰ 24 and amount the said Henry Heykendall one of the heirs \$137⁰⁰ 00 and also the amount she paid to Charles F Wells another of the heirs \$103 which add together make the sum of \$589⁰⁰ 90 Cents and in addition thereto she and her husband Velt Figg delivered over to Charles F Wells the Curator the sum of \$389⁰⁰ 50 which with all amounts to \$959⁰⁰ 10 which taken from the amount which she is chargeable leaves a balance in her hands of \$53⁰⁰ 93 which balance we deduct from her third part of the slaves we estimate at \$1248⁰⁰ her third part is \$416 from which deduct the \$53⁰⁰ 93 leaves her ^{her} balance in the slaves of \$362⁰⁰ 07 we therefore assign to the said Mary Figg a Negro Girl named Biddy about eleven years old estimated now at \$300⁰⁰ leaving a balance due her of \$62⁰⁰ 07 which we direct Charles F Wells Curator to said Estate to pay over to her

and her husband Celi Figg — We then proceed to settle and ascertain the amount to which each of the heirs of said Jacob Heykendall is respectively entitled and what they have received (viz) Charles F Wells and Elizabeth his wife Henry Jacob and John Heykendall, Each of said heirs is entitled to the sum of one hundred and nineteen dollars and twenty eight Cents \$119.²⁸ Charles F Wells and wife has received \$103.⁰⁰ Henry Heykendall has received the sum of \$137.⁰⁰ The above allowance is made only for the land sold in Hardin County and the Personal Estate. The Negroes are not divided but left at the instance of all the heirs to be divided out and the proceeds of hire ^{& their value hereafter} to be subject to future division. The amount now in the hands of Charles F Wells as Custodian is \$137.⁷² As appears by the Amended Account all of which is respectfully submitted
