be paid out of my personal Estate the Remainder or Profit
Arising therefrom to be equally Divided between my Children namely
Elizabeth Carter Mary Patterson Sam Long Sam Long John Long
and Robert Long I Shute around my Trustee Samuel Long
and John Long Executors of this my last Will & Testament Truly
Reporting all former debts and matters Or Debts heretofore made

In the Name of God Amen the 19th day of July eighteen hundred
and thirty William Proctor of the County of Shelby and State of Kentucky
being in sufficient health of body but of sound mind and memory and
intending that it is Appropria for all men Once to die do make this my
last Will and Testament first I give and bequeath to my
Soul into the hands of the Almighty who gave it me and for my body and for
my body I recommend it to the earth whither I live at the direction of
my Executors at the same time I fully revoke all other wills made by me
I being the sole my last will and Testament as to my worldly estate
I give and bequeath that all my Just debts be paid first then
to my Son Walter Proctor the sum of One dollar to my Son David Proctor
the sum of One dollar to my Son Linnenburg Proctor the sum of One dollar
to my Daughter Charlotte Ham one dollar to my Daughter Elizabeth
Mark One dollar to be paid out of my Estate after the decease of
my wife I give to my Son an only wife for term of life all my
Black Land then I bequeath to my Son and to my wife and to my
my household furniture of every Description farming tools and all
that I Possess and own the Estate of my wife Elizabeth Proctor
I Give that all of my estate be my Son David Proctor Household
furniture and all that belongs to the Estate be equally Divided
between my three children Greenville Proctor David Proctor and
William Proctor with the exception of three small legacies above
mentioned at the same time I do appoint my Son Greenville Proctor
and my wife Elizabeth Proctor my Executors of this my last will
and Testament to which I have hereunto set my hand and Seal
