 constitute and ordain this to be my last will and testament in
 manner and form following to wit, my will and desire is that all
 my last debts and funeral Expenses be paid. First I give and
 bequeath to my son Barton Mullikin two Negroes Lily and
 Harriet which he has now in possession also I give and bequeath
 to my son William Mullikin two Negroes Caspy and Eliza
 Caspy he has now in his possession also I give and bequeath to
 my daughter Pircella Hunter Selty and Charlotte Charlotte
 she has now in ^{her} possession and a Bed and furniture also I give
 and bequeath to my Daughter two Negroes which she has
 now in possession Eda and Patience also a Curtain Bed and
 Sted with the furniture which belong to it and a Kure
 named Buck also I give and bequeath to my son James
 Mullikin two Negroes Fanny and Candis but it is understood
 that he is not to have Fanny until after my death also I give him
 my right to all the land which I now live on I give him all
 the Farming utensils also I give and bequeath to my Grand
 Daughter Glendon Mullikin a Negro Girl by the name of Juliette
 and a Bed and furniture also my will and desire is that all
 my household ^{or kitchen} Furniture except what is already given and all my
 Stock of every description and Waggon be equally divided amongst
 my Children Barton William Pircella Elizabeth and James
 and lastly I do appoint George Boyd Burton Mullikin and
 James Young my Executors to this my last will and testament
 Given under my hand and Seal this 25th day of March
 1816 - the said Waggon was then intimated before me
