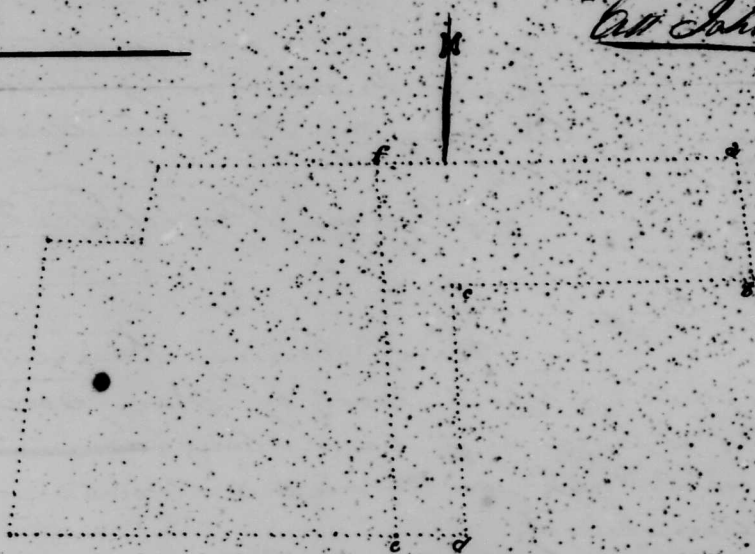

In pursuance of an Order of the Shelby County Court to be directed for the purpose of Selling apart to Elizabeth Wood her Daughter in the Land of her dec^d Husband Is^d Wood. He do Report as follows to wit That the above stat Agreeable to the returns thereof Represent the plantation or Tract on which the dec^d resided containing one hundred and forty eight Acres more or less which was the only land the said Elizabeth Requested us to Sell apart &c

That part included by the letters a b c d e f g h i j k l m n o p q r s t u v w x y z Represent Forty seven acres one Rod and twenty five perches which we have set apart as the Dower of said Elizabeth Wood Widow &c Beginning at two opposite Shingles on the Side of the Road from Shelbyville to Lawrence Corner to Susanina Hallingsworth and John Denny thence S 78° 10' 27" E 127 ft to a Stake on the Side of said Road thence S 15° 6' 33" E 133 ft to a Stake on Augustin Webb's line thence North N 78° 32' 4" E 144 ft to a Stake on David White's line thence N 45° W with said line 89 ft to a Stake thence N 78° 10' 27" E 107 ft to a White Oak Hickory and black oak in M^{rs} Hallingsworth's line thence N 21° W with said line 44 ft to the Beginning. We now Cause my own further Report that we have attested unto the said Elizabeth Wood her Daughter in the Estate of her dec^d Husband &c namely Baba negro man Valued at \$8000 Suchby a neg^r woman at \$250 and Sarah Valued at \$225

body forever and I do hereby Ordain and appoint
my grand son I Sham Parrish my executor to this
my last Will and testament Given under my hand
and Seal this 18th day of October in the year of our
Lord 1845

 with I give devise and bequeath in the following manner. My
 will and devise is that all my Just debts be faithfully and honestly
 paid and that funeral Expences of my burial be discharged
 First I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary Keyhinsdale
 one third of my ^{all} personal Estate and also one third of my land and
 turn over
