In obedience of an Order of the Most Honorable County Court of Shelby to us directed for the purpose of settling a part to Nancy Harding her dower in the land and slaves of her deceased husband John Harding having therefore met she the said Nancy declining or refusing to receive that part of the Estate which she was entitled to wishing only to take an equal part with the heirs & representatives of the said decedent, We your Commissioners then proceeded to act upon a second Order Commanding us to make distribution of the Estate of the said decedent amongst his heirs and legal representatives we then surveyors (under the direction of the Administrator) the lands represented in the above plat and formed the whole into the lots here represented by the several numbers marked as shown and after fixing the value of each lot having respect to local situation and improvements proceeded to make distribution partly by consent and partly by lotting as the following part of this report will more fully illustrate
