

I Jane Boyd of Shelby County and State of Kentucky do make public and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following

It is my will and desire that if I depart this life before my sister Hannah Boyd that she shall have all the Slaves which I have a right to out of the Estate of my Father William Boyd late of said County deceased and all the right title Claim and Interest which I own in the Slaves belonging to said Estate I will and bequeath to my sister Phibe Cook five Shaw of Stock in the bank of Kentucky which I purchased of William G Boyd for the transfer of which I hold his obligation I also bequeath to my sister Phibe Cook all the money or demand for money which I may have at the time of my death I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint William G Boyd my Executor of this my last will and Testament I do

In the name of God Amen

I John Newnam of the County of Shelby and State of Kentucky being <sup>very</sup> weak in body but in sound mind and memory Thanks be given unto God and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills and testaments of any kind or nature whatever

In the first place I recommend my Soul to God who gave it and my Body to the Earth - Then my just debts I wish to be paid and my Funeral Expenses all of which I wish taken out of my Estate which I leave, then I will and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth one third part of my real and personal Estate including all my household furniture Excepting one Bed and furniture to which I will and bequeath to my Mother Elizabeth New

I further will unto my Father Henry Newman one Horse & wish my wife Elizabeth to have her Choice of my two Horses my Father is to have the Other I also will and bequeath unto my Brother Simon Newman my Saddle and bridle and unto my Infant yet unborn provided it should live to enjoy the Same I will and bequeath unto my said unborn Infant two thirds of my tract of land which land was deeded to me by my Father Henry Newman also any balance of my personal Estate if any should remain after the fulfillment of my above mentioned Will I wish the Same to go to the use and benefit of my said unborn Infant provided it should live to enjoy the Same and if in case the said unborn Infant should not survive to enjoy the said <sup>and</sup> property according to this my last will and Testament I then and in that Case will and bequeath unto my Brother Thomas Newman the said two thirds of my above mentioned tract of land <sup>the balance of my</sup> estate if any might be remaining unto my said unborn Child <sup>in Case</sup> and the said Child should die I wish my Father to have and distribute the Same if any remaining as he may think best know all men by these presents that I John Newman do appoint my Father Henry Newman my Executor given under my hand and seal this 2<sup>d</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> January 1817

As Witnesseth I wish it especially understood in this my last will and Testament that my said Brother Thomas Newman is not at liberty to sell or mortgage the above mentioned two thirds of land but in that Case I wish the said two thirds of the said tract of land to ascend to my Father Henry Newman to dispose of as he thinks best provided however that my said unborn Infant should not survive to enjoy the Same the day and date above written.
