Shelbyville Ky. April 20th 1814

Appeared this day before me Margaret Atherton and made
oath that on the fifteenth Inst. about the middle of the day
William Lewis who was then sick at her house was sitting up
and appeared sensible that he told John Chapman and in her
presence stated to the sd. Chapman that he had left in the care
of Capt Shewels living in Mairdstown Ky betwixt seventy and
Eighty Dollars and also other property viz a chest of clothes a
watch &c. which he willed to the sd Chapman in case of his
death the money to be divided between the sisters of Chapman
and the remainder at his own disposal as a reward for the said
John Chapman's attention to him during his illness and further
that the said William Lewis did die on the eighteenth Inst.
