Whereas I have sold the plantation then on in Nelson County, mentioned in the Deed ending "Part of the my last will and Testament to be left to my wife Esther Cooper during her natural life and at the end thereof that whosoever of her said wife's natural life then to be owned by me James Cooper I do now in consideration thereof leave to my said wife during her natural life the place or land that I then lately purchased off Robert Bicknapp lying in Shelby County on the waters of Plum Creek at Branch of said River, containing the same land and after her decease to my son James Cooper, I do hereby declare that of the said land to make and improve a place to be as follows: to be on forty acres of said land then then a one hundred and fifty acres land off to him said James Cooper, intending such improvement to make by me

In the Name of God Amen I, Lazarus Tilly, of Shelby County and State Kentucky being very sick and weak in Body, but of perfect mind and Reasoning, do hereby give to God for all his mercies calling to mind the Mortality of my Body, and that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain my last will and Testament that I do hereby bequeath and give of all I own and Recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God who give it and my Body to the earth, to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my executors nothing doubting but I shall at the General Resurrection Recieve the same by the mighty Power of God and as Touching such worldly estate wherewith I have been God bless me in this life I give, bequeath and dispose of the same in the following manner

After all my Just debts are paid I give to and an Negro woman called her Judson so far as this the said Negro woman has shared my land with Richard Graves and his wife Melly Graves who with the said Negro Melly who work and be well treated as long as she will be understood that if the Negro woman should be afflicted or unable to work the said Graves and his wife shall maintain her so long as she live without any expense To the rest of my children all the Balance of my real estate such as land Negroes &c is to be equally divided between all of my children my son Henry has undertaken to make a crop for me this present year he has continued to make a crop with all that is left in for the benefit of making the crop the Balance of my Negroes except what is left in the crop is to be dealt with as the law directs likewise all of the Balance of my estate except what is engaged in the crop is to be dealt with as the law directs I am Henry Aggy and John Martin have being as witnesses my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my hand and seal the 1st day of April 1814 Signed sealed and delivered in the presence of
