I Robert Allison of Shelby County and State of Kentucky being considerably advanced in years & infirm in body calling to mind that all men must die therefore for the purpose of distributing such property as I may be possessed of do make public and declare this my last Will and Testament as follows I do hereby certify that it is my Will and desire that my son Robert Allison shall own and be possessed of the home and farm on which I at present live to him & his heirs forever, containing about 230 Acres more or less together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging including the Stock farming utensils and household furniture subject to the following exceptions & conditions to-wit.

he my said son Robert is hereby required to pay all my Just debts
 and funeral expences he is to furnish and appropriate for my wife
 Mary Alison her present sleeping Room free from incumbrance
 with liberty of passing to and from the same through the house
 when she please, to furnish her comfortable fire, and every necessary
 maintenance, such as good clothing and money for customary expences
 as long as she lives. Also her bed and furniture Case of chamber table Locking
 glass &c. which at her death are to be at her own disposal. Also my said
 Wife shall have for her own use during her life here my Negro Woman
 Molly to wait upon her and in case the said Molly should die I Robert is
 to supply her Mother with a servant suitable to attend her he appropriated
 at all times to her service as long as she lives. He is also to furnish his mother
 with a comfortable house and saddle at all times which she may wish
 to Ride. It is further my will that my Wife Mary shall have an
 set of silver tea spoons to the value of as shee pleases said spoons are
 marked with the letter D. Again it is my will and desire that my son Robert
 shall pay to my daughter Polly ~~the sum of~~ the sum of ~~one thousand~~ ^{one thousand} dollars to be
 paid in ~~four~~ ^{four} annual payments the first to be
 paid ~~on the~~ ^{on the} first day of my death with legal interest on the
 first payment from the time of my death till due and till paid
 and also similar interest on each subsequent payment and to come
 due if not punctually paid and to secure to the said Polly the sum
 of \$2000 in the manner here specified she is hereby vested with
 a perpetual life and fee simple estate in an equal undivided
 moiety of my house and plantation first above bequeathed
 to my son Robert till I payments are made to her her heirs or legal
 representatives as shall hereafter be mentioned. It is also my will
 that the said payments shall be made to my daughter Polly
 or her heirs and to no other person except as shall be provided
 hereafter. It is further my will that that my son Robert under
 similar conditions shall give my daughter Polly two of the best
 beds the my house with three furniture two good horse saddle and
 with the brass chipping staff and clothing. Also that I Polly
 is to be comfortably provided for and supported in my present
 Dwelling house with a house standing working free &c. suitable
 to her convenience as long as she my Negro woman and in case
 my wife Mary should die it is then my will that my Negro
 Woman Molly shall become the property of my daughter Polly
 to be used or disposed off at her discretion the whole of the above property

Bequeathed to my Daughter Polly is to be paid in her entire Control during her lifetime
 and if she should not marry or marrying she without issue in that Case any of
 the principal or interest remaining on any proceeds thereof shall be equally divided
 between her three brothers Hugh, Joseph & Nathl. Allison and also an equal
 share to the two daughters of Polly Congleton Dec and a similar equal
 share to Mary Bradshaw daughter of Jemmy Bradshaw Dec. Moreover if this
 Polly should marry & die leaving issue then her property as above will in any
 remaining proceeds thereof shall descend to her heirs only and to no other person
 except as above provided. It is further my Will that my Negro Man
 Frank shall belong to my son Hugh Allison together with my Book and
 an equal share of my books to be equally divided between him & my son Joseph
 Again I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Allison my Negro Man Tom
 my bookboard and an equal share of my books to be divided between him and
 his brother Hugh. It is further my Will that my son Nathl. shall keep
 and support during his lifetime my sister Mary in a decent & comfortable
 manner. It is further my Will that my son Nathl. shall give to my
 grand daughter Jemmy Congleton her saddle a bridle and a horse capable
 to be valued at not less than twenty dollars also a bed and furniture also
 one spinning wheel and a Case to be worth at least \$10. together with a
 bureau to the value of \$20 and also to keep and support her in a decent
 and comfortable manner as long as she my dear daughter. It is further my
 Will that my son Nathl. shall furnish to my grand daughter Jemmy Parke
 late Jemmy Congleton one bureau to the value of twenty dollars. It is further my Will
 that my son Nathl. shall furnish to my grand daughter Mary Bradshaw
 a horse saddle and bridle to be worth at least one hundred dollars when she shall
 marry or come to the age of twenty one years. It is further my Will and desire
 that my no Appraisement Inventory or Sale shall take place with respect to
 my estate but that my son Nathl. shall personally attend to the perform-
 ance of the duties herein required of him under the power and authority of the
 whole of the estate herein bequeathed to him. Lastly it is my Will and desire that
 my son Hugh Allison & Nathl. Allison with James Brown shall be the executor
 of this my last Will and testament and I assure in hereby vested with power
 and authority to superintend the transactions of the other two executors to wit
 that this Will shall be carried into effect according to the true intent and
 meaning thereof. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
