 that my tract of land and farms near Shelbyville
 on the west part was where on Benjamin Eggleston now
 lies, be sold by my Executors herein after named at such
 time and on such credit as they shall think most advantageous
 and do here by authorizing and empowering them or
 such of them as may then act as such to convey the
 same in fee simple to the purchaser or purchasers
 thereof

 Slaves Daniel and Aggy his wife be sold in like manner
 by my said Executors and the sums arising from the sale of
