Estate except a negro Child (Maria Hogue) During her Widowhood with full power to Dispose of the personal Estate in any way or manner that She may think Best (She Supporting and educating my Children) but no power to Sell Dispose off or make any Transfer or Change of any part of my Real Estate

2^d I Will and bequeath to my Daughter Namintta Donner Allen the Abassi named negro Child Maria Hogue

3^d If when my Children shall have attained to the Age of twenty ^{one} years it is my wife and Desire that my Wife Sally Allen Shant make to them any Advances of personal property which She may deem expedient, bringing the same into account against them whenever a general Division shall be made

4^d If either of my Children Should die without Issue & in their Minority it is my will that their Share shall be Equally Divided among my Surviving Children 5^d It is my will that after the Death of my said Wife Sally Allen that her part of my Estate Real and personal shall be equally divided among my Surviving Children 6^d It is my will and Desire that if my s^d Wife (with the Consent of my Executors hereafter named) shall be disposed to make a Division of my Estate in the manner hereafter expressed she shall be at liberty to do so

7^d I do hereby nominate and appoint my s^d wife Sally Allen Robert P. Allen and Thomas Allens Executors and Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this Sixteenth Day of October Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and fifteen 8^d It is my will that if my s^d wife Sally Allen should marry then my estate to be Equally Divided between my wife aforesaid and my Children Preston Greenup and Namintta Donner Allen Inter lived before Signed Signed Sealed published and Declared in presence of Benoni S Newland
