of my Estate both real and personal after all my lawful debts
are paid I do Request that my Daughter Sarah Hawkins shall
have but one share of Estate and that the Balance of my
Estate both real & personal shall be equally divided between
my other nine Children to wit John, Thomas, Margaret, Nancy,
