In the name of God amen I Abraham Hopewell of the County of Shelby and State of Kentucky do hereby constitute ordain and make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others by me before made

In premis I will give and devise to my friends William Taylor of Shelby County and Barbara Taylor of Clark County or to the Survivors of them all my Estate both Real and personal in which I may die possessed of in trust subject to such distribution as herein after specified and the said Executors or Survivors of them or such one of them as shall think proper to act as such shall have full power and Authority to sell or otherwise to dispose of all my lands and other property, debts & make Compromises and transfers to make and to receive conveyances as the case may be in the name of either or both & that such sale be made at the discretion of aeting Executor or Executors as may shall pay all my just debts and after Satisfying all all expenses attending the same deliver the remainders some in the following manner to be paid in the order as is herein expressed

First I give and devise to my friend Mr Rachel Finnie for her personal ship towards me the sum of Fifty pounds in money

Second I give and devise to Mrs Susan Taylor wife of my friend William Taylor of Floyd's Fork the sum of Two Hundred Dollars in money

Thirdly I give and devise the remainder of what ever money there may be after paying all debts as aforesaid & the foregoing Legacies

It is my will be paid over to my brother Isaac Hopewell and my Sister Hannah Nap one moiety to each or to legal representatives or representatives of my sd. brother & Sister in case of their death or

Application to my sd. Exors after the expiration of twelve months after the Collection of the amount of Sales of my sd. Estate

Now It is my will and desire and I hereby give my said Estate or the aeting one the same full power and Authority over any property I have in any of the United States or those given in the State and further authorize here or there to transact the business out of this State by power of attorney and their power to transact as he or their pleasure

Now It is my will and express desire that there be no inventory or appraisement of my estate

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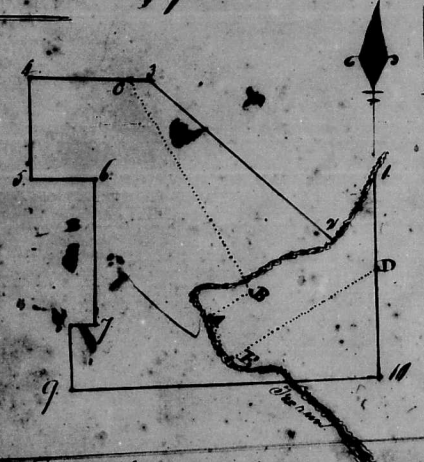

Survived for Mary Hinton Widow of Wm Hinton decd her survey being the one third part of his land. Beginning at a double corner oak, blackoak on the north bank of the river at the left of the house with the dotted line North 66.



East 58 poles to a stake on the north side of a crop fence thence with another dotted line North 26 West 280 poles to a stake in one of the original lines thence East to a black oak and from words corner to Jacob Lawrence thence South 48 East with his line to for run thence up the same with the several measures thence until opposite an ash white oak and elm on the east side thence South 118 poles passing a line of trees to two white oak and holly locust in a line of William Cole thence with a dotted line South 66 West 208 poles crossing the old path to a sycamore on the north side of the river thence up the river with the measures thence to the beginning 66 acres John Craig At 22
