her. Further, my will and desire is, that all the
remainder of my estate shall remain and be in the
possession of my beloved wife Agnes Graves during
her natural lifetime. And further My will and
desire is that after the payment of all my just
debts, that the remainder of my estate at the
death of the said Agnes Graves shall be appraised
and sold at public sale as the law direct under
the direction of Richard Graves and Amos Hobbs

227 administration of said estate, and that we will
negotiate named Mary excepted, which I hereby
leave and bequeath unto Thomas Martin for his services
to me and other reasons known to myself and
further. My will and desire is that the money
arising from the sale of said property, shall be
equally divided amongst and my children.

Next of the sp. My will and desire is that one
equal moiety of said estate hereby descending to
Elizabeth Lathrop shall be lodged in the
hands of Richard Graves for her use and under
his directions. Further My will and desire is
that an inventory of my property shall be
taken at my death, but no sale take place till
