In the name of God amen

I George Roberts of the state of Kentucky and County
Shelby being weak and Low in body but of perfect mind
and memory do make this my last will and Testament in
manner and form following to wit:

First of all I give and bequeath to my wife Catherine
Roberts the plantation and land whereon I live together
with all my house hold furniture farming utensils Horses
Cattle Hogs and sheep and a negro man named Jacob during
her natural life and after her death to be equally divided
between my two sons John Roberts and Henry Roberts
to gether with all Debts which may be now owing
to me to be also collected by my aforesaid two sons and
equally Divided between them when collected
and I hereby do appoint my above mentioned two
sons John Roberts and Henry Roberts to my lawful Executors

And I do hereby revoke and disannul all other wills heretofore made by me and hereby acknowledging this to be my last will and Testament do witness my hand and Seal this 25 day of June 1810, NB. As my three Daughters Elizabeth Mary and Katherine have already had their proportionable part of my estate to be understood that I do not intend by this will to give them any thing more
