Know all Men by these presents that I Mary Hills
of Shelby County and State of Kentucky being of Sound mind
and perfect Memory; but in a low State of health and
Knowing that it is Appointed unto all men to die, do to
prevent Confusion after my Decease dispose of my
worldly goods in the following Manner. (To wit) First of all
I order that all my Lawfull Debts and funeral expences
be paid out of My estate by my Executors herein after
to be named. Secondly I order that my Lands be sold
when my Son Isaac Shall be of age if my

 sold, they are to be held as the Law directs and
 if sold I order that my dear wife have the
 One fourth of the price of said lands insted of the third
 of the income of them, and that the rest be Equally
 Divided between my Children. Thirdly I give and
 bequeath the One third of all my moveable property
 to My dear wife to be here forever, and the rest to
 be equally Divided amongst my Children which
 property is either to be sold, or not sold as the Exors
 may think best & they I constitute appoint and
 make my dear wife Margaret Hill & George V.
