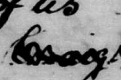

I, Jacob Links of the County of Shelby, State of Kentucky, being sick & weak of body but of perfect mind & memory, & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament, principally, and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God, that gave it, and as for my body, I recommend it to the earth, to be buried, at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again, at the general resurrection, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith, it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give and dispose in the following manner. First It is my desire that all my debts & general charges be paid, & Item, I give and bequeath to Anne

my beloved wife, the land that I now live on, together with all the household furniture, and her saddle & geese during her natural life, likewise one third part of the stock; But after her decease, the whole to return back and to be equally divided among my four Children to wit; Anne Link, Betsey Link, Katy Link, and Sally Link. 2^d It is my desire, that if there is not a negro boy purchased before my decease, that my executors buy one, and said negro boy to be kept in the Estate, till my youngest child is seventeen years of age, then s. negro boy to be sold, and the valuation of him to be equally divided amongst my four Children. 3^d I likewise constitute, make, and ordain my son Henry Fullinwider, & Jacob Fullinwider, executors of this my Last Will and Testament, and I hereby utterly disallow, revoke, & disannul all, and every former Wills and Legacies, by me in any wise before named, ratifying, and confirming this to be my Last Will, and Testament. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this tenth day of May Eighteen hundred and four.
