and an equal share with the rest of my Children beside
It is my desire that fifty pounds be taken from the property
that I lay off to my son Isaac and that it be added to my Estate
in general and that he have the remainder and an equal share
of my Estate with the rest of my Children and he said that it
Was his desire that his wife Lucy Newland and his son John
should settle his Estate as they saw proper and that they should
sell the Slaves if they please and buy others with the money and
also that they might sell his tract of Land lying on Brasha
Creek and known by the Cove tract for the support of the family
