Pursuant to an order of the county court of  
 Shelby to us directed we the undersigned have  
 proceeded to divide the slaves belonging to the estate  
 of Rich<sup>d</sup>. Ridgway dec<sup>d</sup> amongst his heirs in  
 the following manner (to wit) after finding the  
 value of the slaves belonging to said estate to be  
 £840 to which Mary Ridgway widow of said  
 decedent in satisfaction thereof accounts for the sum  
 of sixty pounds the value of a negro girl named  
 Jane deeded to her by the said Rich<sup>d</sup> Ridgway  
 in his life time as to us appears from an instrument  
 of writing recorded in the county court of Buckingham  
 county Virginia which said sixty pounds added to  
 £840 make £900 of which her dower is £300 for  
 which we assigned her Tom, Betty & Judy valued  
 at £222 and the deficiency of eighteen pounds  
 the heirs present agree to pay unto the widow  
 for her to hold during her life
