and ordain this my last will and testament first
I willingly resign my soul to god who gave it and
my body to be buried at the discretion of my surviving
friends and as to my worldly goods I dispose of
as follow. first I desire that all my lawfull
debts shall be paid and the rest of my Estate
real and personal Land and every thing that
I possess I leave to my beloved wife Sarah Connely
freely to Possess and enjoy her lifetime and to
dispose of at her discretion to give it to
who

She please and if she my said wife should
 Decease without making any will it is my desire
 that the hole of her estate be equally divided among
 my children namely William - Mary - Sarah
 Thompson - Elizabeth - Jesse James - Nancy and
 Stephen to them and their heirs forever - I consider my
 self in debt to my daughter Elizabeth five pounds
 for her dowry and do desire it to be paid it is further
 my desire and I order it so that my son Stephen
 shall have three years schooling to be paid out of my
 estate - Elizabeth five pounds to be paid in property
 it is my desire that my daughter Nancy have a
 feather bed and furniture and a cow and calf
 when she wants them and likewise Elizabeth when
 she wants it lastly I appoint my beloved wife
 Sarah Connely and my good neighbour Agedy Burns
 and Andrew Allen executors of this my last will
