If it is not Obtained I allow
her to sell one hundred acres out of my own Tract lying on -
Cumberland River. on any part of it Excepting near the
Whiteoak Spring or the Salt peter Cove which lies about
half a mile up the river all this I allow her as long as
she remains a widow. If in case her way of living I do
not Allow her to dispose of any of the land at all and
like wise I allow her to have no more than her thirds of
Every thing now belonging to me but as long as she
remains a widow I allow her to have the care of all my
possessions Next I give unto my well beloved and Eldest son
Nemely George Green. Three hundred Acres of land out of
my own Tract lying on Cumberland River including
