to be decently interred by the direction of my Executors
hereafter named. and my Soul to Almighty God who
gave it depending only upon the Alloning righte-
ousness of Jesus Christ for the pardon of all my sins
and acceptance with God.

And for the settling of my testamentary
do nominate and appoint my wife Polly, James
McBorhy and James Parker my Executors.

I Order that all legal debts that I owe and funeral
charges be paid out of my personal Estate.

And I will to my well beloved wife Polly all the
property she had of her own before our marriage
and all my personal property to her and my youngest
child Polly to be equally divided between them.

I Will to my daughter Nancy Walker two negroes
sally and Melly.

I Will to my son James Walker Pompey and Doll
two negroes.

I Will to my daughter Polly Eliza Walker One
negro wench named Fanny - I Order that my
wife shall have my negro wench Doll as long as
she remains in her widowhood I likewise order
and

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And it is my Will and I do hereby empower my Executors
to have the Care of my old negroe Pompey and at his
paying of forty five pounds to them that he shall be
set free and the said money to be appropriated to the
schooling and Support of my Children -

I do likewise empower my Executors to have full power
to transact all things relative in respect of this said land
I now live on either by Lease or Deed and to Apply the profits
arising from the same to the Support of my family as
much as is necessary and the remainder to be equally
divided amongst the legates As Witness my Hand and
seal this eighteenth day of August One thousand eight
hundred -
