Richard Jones's Will
 In the name of God, amen. I Richard Jones of
 Shelby County, do make and declare this to be my last will
 and Testament. First. After all my just debts are paid
 I leave my estate to be divided in following manner
 I give my daughter Polly Johnson's children (my daughter
 being deceased) one negro named Lehana and one dollar
 to her and her heirs forever. I give to my daughter
 Nancy Jones, one dollar to her and her heirs forever having
 formerly given to her a negro named Becka who is negro
 her husband sold to George Metcalf or at least Metcalf
 has the said negro Becka in possession. the title of said
 negro Becka I do forever relinquish. I give to my
 daughter Elizabeth Metcalf one negro named Esther
 and one dollar to her and her heirs forever. I give to my
 daughter Fanny Metcalf one negro named Squire
 and one dollar to her and her heirs forever. I give to
 my daughter Jane Metcalf one negro named Maria to
 her and her heirs forever. I give to my daughter
 Ann Metcalf one negro boy named Cha to her
 and her heirs forever. I lend to my beloved wife
 Elizabeth Jones during her life or widowhood the
 plantation whereon we now live, likewise for her to
 possess and make use of the crop of corn, small grain

and to use for the purpose of supporting the family and discharging my just debts. Also I leave to my wife Elizabeth Jones during her life or widowhood this ~~age~~ negro man. James a negro man. Manuel a negro man and Lucy a negro woman, also my stock of horses, cattle, sheep and hogs. also all my plantation tools, house and kitchen furniture &c. and after her decease or widowhood (if she should marry) the estate I leave my wife Elizabeth Jones to be divided as follows, the land we live on to be equally divided between my sons John Jones and Silas Jones, and the balance of my estate I leave my wife as above to be equally divided between my son William Jones John Jones, Silas Jones and my daughter Susanna Jones or so many of them as may be then living. My son John Jones to get a feather bed, and my son Silas Jones to get a horse and feather bed. also my daughter Susanna Jones to get a horse and feather bed before the division last mentioned take place. I appoint my wife Elizabeth Jones and my son John Jones executor to my estate. In testimony that the above is my last will and testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 28th day of December 1807
