Imprimis, I give to my daughter Elizabeth one feather bed and furniture one woman saddle which she has now in possession, one belt call'd a Antiloc to be delivered by my executor at her marriage or on she arrive to lawful age.

Item. I leave unto my beloved wife Jane Perry the plantation and land whereon I now live with all my stock of horses, cows, hogs, sheep and hounds cart to be by her freely enjoyed, as also my household & kitchen furniture, plantation tools during her natural life, and the help of my negroes.

Item. It is my will and desire if after all my just debts ^{are} paid there should be any remainder either by bill bond or otherwise, the same be equally divided amongst all my children or their legal representatives. Item. It is my will and desire that if either of my children should die not having lawful issue or representatives of children alive

256 at that time of his or her death, that then and in
that case all and every part or parts of my estate
herely given to them or either of them shall revert
to surviving brothers and sisters or their legal
representatives. Lastly I do constitute and appoint
my sons Ranaoeph Perry Robert Perry Roderick

last will and testament, hereby overruling all
